## FLEXIBLE PAYMENT PLAN

There are three ways to pay, the full amount with one check, 2 checks, one with today's date and one with a July 1 date or send as many post dated checks as you would like to as long as they total \$485.

## NEW MEAT CSA

This year we are partnering with Morning Star Family Farm and offering our farm as a dropsite to our CSA members for their meat CSA. The cost is \$500 for five boxes, one per month, coordinating with the five months of our CSA deliveries. The meat will be frozen and you will need to come to the farm to pick it up. ## THE SAGA OF SEEDS

As I transitioned from gardening to farming, I moved away from open pollinated to hybrid seeds as we needed the productivity, reliability and concentrated harvest time that hybrids offered. Varieties came and went as new improved or at least changed and most likely more expensive ones became available. Then Monsanto purchased one of the main seed companies and I decided not to support Monsanto by choosing not to buy varieties they owned. Now seeds are being patented, including Utility Patents for traits where no one can breed a plant using that trait. One of these traits is for a multi-leaf lettuce where full size heads can be cut with one bottom cut to yield salad sized leaves. This trend is going to create moral and money issues ahead.
